Practices Over Policies

Recently following the death of our brother Eugene Gates, Jr. postal management across the State of Texas were mandated to change the start times for letter carriers to 7:30 am by the influence from the media and Congress who advocated for the change. Our brother collapsed in the yard of his customers on what was one of the hottest days in history. The National Association of Letter

Carriers (NALC) immediately got involved and discovered that the Heat Illness Prevention Program (HIPP) training records reported by management in Brother Gates' HERO profile were falsified. The information entered in his HERO profile indicated that the training was conducted on January 25, 2023, yet according to Brother Gates' clock rings, he was non-scheduled on that day. An inquiry into the other carriers' training records at Lakewood Station revealed much of the same.

Over the years, postal management has incorporated postal practices over postal policies. Here is yet another example. According to Postal policy, the HIPP began in May of 2018, and is to be initiated during the period of April through October. Management was aware of their responsibility to provide letter carriers with the heat-related training which includes 15-minute HIPP Safety Talks, a 20-minute online course and a 35-minute curriculum-based course on Heat Stress Recognition & Prevention. Every carrier was to receive a safety card displaying the signs and symptoms of a heat-related illness. A similar card was to be placed in every postal vehicle. Posters were to be visibly posted in the office for everyone to see. Instead of complying with the policy,

management initiated a practice to give the appearance of compliance. Ask yourself, did you have the online and curriculum-based training on heat stress? Was management giving the safety talks on heat prior to the death of Eugene Gates? For most of you or all of you the answer is no.

The purpose of those training courses is to equip letter carriers with the essential knowledge to protect themselves in the extreme outdoor heat. The training record is confirmation to Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) that letter carriers have been trained to protect themselves. When this information is falsified, it places every letter carrier in danger. I have asked the stewards in every office to investigate the training records for the letter carriers within their respective offices. The stewards cannot get this accomplished without the help from you. We have allowed the Postal Service to operate on their made-up practices far too long. It took the death of Brother Gates to expose them to the public. Let's take matters further by exposing how they have manipulated the system by falsifying the training records of carriers throughout the district.

Follow these simple steps to provide your steward with your training records:

- Go to Liteblue login click the HERO login
- Click on Assigned Training (Located on the right)
- Click on Completed Training (Located on the left)
- Scroll to FY23 Heat Stress Recognition and Prevention (Or other training you are interested in seeing)
- Click the "View Completion" drop down arrow at far
- Choose View Training Details
- Scroll to the bottom of the page, click "Transcript History" drop down menu, this will show who entered the course completion information and the time and date of the action. You should print this screen for use in any grievance related to falsified training.
- Go back to the Profile page. You will see three dots on

Steve is retiring with a year left on his term, which will require the branch president to select his successor for the remaining year of his term. Without question, it will be hard to fill his shoes.


On a personal note, I wish my good friend many more years of health and prosperity. Lord knows he has earned it!


