# OFFICIAL NOTICE OF NOMINATIONS FOR OFFICERS OF LONE STAR BRANCH 132

Nominations for the election of officers of NALC Lone Star Branch 132 for 2025-2027 will be conducted at the branch meeting on Monday, October 7, 2024. The candidate for office or another member in good standing shall make the nomination from the floor. Every nominee must complete an Official NALC Lone Star Branch 132 Nomination Form, which will be available at the October branch meeting. After nominations have closed and every nominee has completed the official form, the list of candidates will be read into the record by the Recording Secretary. Candidates can only be nominated for one office, except for the position of Editor. Nominations will be held for the following positions: President, Executive Vice-President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, MBA/Health Benefits Representative, Sergeant-at-Arms, Director of Retirees, Trustees (5 positions), and Editor.

The election for officers will be conducted by a secret mail-out ballot to the home addresses of eligible Branch 132 members on October 25, 2024. Each envelope will contain instructions, a ballot, a secret envelope, and a return envelope. **If you do not receive the ballot, call the Election Chairperson, Lenora Salinas, at 469-408-3104.** The ballot must be returned by November 22, 2024, to be counted.

# CALL TO ACTION!

I have told the membership in both the branch meeting and at the steward's training that we are at war with the Postal Service. Did I mean that we are literally fighting one another? No, but what I meant was the Postal Service is angry with the Union and with its members; therefore, Postal management is coming at us from every angle. Management is constantly on teleconference call after teleconference call strategizing their next move against letter carriers. Those with the most

power tell their subordinates not to let any carrier listen to these calls as they are afraid we might gain leverage over their attempts to attack us.

Postal management has gone as far as taking the responsibility of writing contentions for grievances away from the station supervisors and managers and assigned those duties to someone they believe has the knowledge and the ability to overcome our Formal A representatives. I want to assure the membership that there is no reason for any of you to fear. Branch 132 is armed with warriors. We have a team of fighters who are educated, dedicated and committed to the cause. We do not have to have daily scheduled teleconference calls because each of us is well capable of handling any situation brought on by the Postal Service. That is what is troubling for them and what keeps them upset.

This is a call to action. I am asking every letter carrier to perform your duties to the best of your ability. Watch your attendance. Follow the rules. Attend the union meeting and get more involved with your union. Don't engage in anything on the clock or off the clock that can draw attention to you. Our National Agreement is and has always been on our side. As long as you are abiding by the Postal Service's rules, you will be protected. As we are following the rules, let us make it a joint venture all across the branch to enforce every article of our National Agreement in every post office within the branch by filing grievances when violations occur. As I stated to you in my last article that you are responsible for your own safety, I am now adding it is your duty to force the Postal Service to honor our rights. Together let us show the Postal Service that we will stand united against their attacks.

The ability for supervisors, managers, and postmasters to make decision for their offices is being removed from them. Do not get misled. They are being told which employee to target and they are following those instructions for fear of being reprimanded themselves. I promise you, if push comes to shove, it will be you before them. Let's show the Postal Service that we will utilize our resources (our National Agreement) to gain the respect that should be automatically given to letter carriers since we are the backbone of the Postal Service. There would be no Postal Service without letter carriers. Stop getting into your personal feelings and look at the big picture. If we work together, this war the Postal Service is raging against letter carriers will not prevail. Keep saying no matter what the attack is, we won't turn back. The fight is real, but we are ready. #### Why does Postal Management Hate the City Letter Carriers So Much?



You stand in between management and their pay raises (Pay for Performance). What does that really mean? Trick as many carriers as possible into giving up their contractual rights. How do they get that done? Step one, have conference calls teaching lower management how to harass and get over on the city letter carrier. Step two, teach lower management to cover up the truth and do whatever it takes to miseducate and mislead city letter carriers which would further their ability to get over on the city letter carrier.


So, what do you do as a City Letter Carrier to protect yourself? Step one, educate yourself. Download the NALC Letter Carrier App on your phone, on your lunch and breaks, read a rule or two every day. Step two, reach out to your union leaders and ask questions, don't let management manipulate you into giving up your contractual

rights. It is much easier for management to deceive you, if you do not know your rights. Step three, attend your monthly branch meetings.

At times, management will tell some carriers not to fill out a PS Form 3971 when you have been absent on leave, or they may say, "you don't need to fill out a PS Form 3996, we know your route is too long." Management is setting you up for failure! You may get away with it for some time, but when something goes wrong, then how can you hold management accountable, when you failed to do your job as well.

Remember to always fill out a PS Form 3971 anytime you are on leave. This would include Annual leave, Sick leave, or Continuation of Pay, if you get injured on the job. If you are out of leave, you still must fill out a PS Form 3971 requesting LWOP, and always save a copy. If management refuses to give you a copy, get with your steward. After you obtain your copy, scan it into your phone just in case you need it down the road and cannot find your original copy. That is just one small bit of information. There is much more.

Do not let Postal management get over on you, learn your rights.






